# **Christmas thoughts**

As we look forward to Christmas, and as we hear the news that less than half of people in this country described themselves as Christian in the 2021 census, we have some serious thinking to do. Doubtless the purveyors of chocolate, alcohol, luxury foods, toys, video games, decorations, jewellery and books will continue to do well this month: our nation will still celebrate Christmas after a fashion. But Christ is less and less at the centre of it. Increasingly our task as Christians and Churches is to teach again the very basics of the faith, not assuming that people know anything at all about it. The simple Christmas story is a good place to start, but we also need to explain the deeper meaning and encourage people towards commitment.

So I have a double-barrelled Christmas message this year. To Christians and Churches I say: Rejoice in Jesus, all that he is and means, and seek to find new ways of sharing him with those around you. To the majority of people, who don't associate with Christianity and Church: I encourage you, not just to celebrate Christmas, but to let your local church, or a Christian friend, share with you more of its wonderful deeper meaning. A very happy and meaningful Christmas to you all.

### **Lay Ministry**

I want to outline some significant changes to the oversight and care of our Readers and Lay Ministers as we move into the New Year.

In recent years I have held direct oversight in this area. I have asked Canon Andrew Coleby, our Lay Ministry Training Officer, to hold this responsibility until a new Diocesan Bishop arrives, and I am grateful to him for agreeing to do so.

I am very grateful to Canon John Hall and Ben Lewis for acting as Wardens of Lay Ministry in our two archdeaconries. They are stepping down at the end of this year, and I shall be appointing a priest and a Reader to work together in each archdeaconry: offering pastoral care, ensuring ongoing ministry development and training, and monitoring the working agreements between incumbents and lay ministers. Those four appointments will be announced soon: they will work under Andrew's leadership and alongside Canon Vyv Wainwright who has a diocesan role in convening and caring for Readers.

Rachel Lomas in my office has been supporting Joanne Gibson in the huge task of paperwork, admin, and safeguarding checks for the lay ministers. I am grateful to them both. Rachel will take full responsibility for that, working with Andrew Coleby, from January.

#### **Video Sermons and Psalm Meditations**

I have continued to record these for every Sunday and Tuesday. Our new website doesn't put them up automatically, but they do appear there, and on the Diocesan Facebook page.

# **Bishops' Office**

**Alex Tolley** will move back to the PA role for the Bishop of Peterborough, though part-time. **Rachel Lomas**, also part-time, is stepping up to a new role as Assistant PA to the Bishop of Peterborough. Alex and Rachel will share the substantial workload between them: you might hear from either one. **Suzanne Carter** will remain as PA to the Bishop of Brixworth, also part-time, supporting Bishop John in the various admin responsibilities of that role.

**Bishop John**, as Acting Bishop, and **Bishop Jonathan**, as Archbishop's Commissary, and our Honorary Assistant Bishops **Ed Condry** and **Andrew Proud**, will be supported in complementary ways by Steve, Alex and Rachel.

I'm sure you will hear more detail on all this once I've moved on, including the probable appointment of an admin assistant in the spring.
