would like to see happen particularly around discipleship and deeper relationships. We are encouraged and excited for the future.

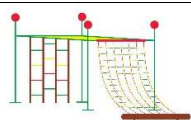
Over the last few years we have taken part on two pieces of NICER research (National Institute for Christian Education Research) through Faith in the Nexus. The first of these was Church Toddler Groups seeking to answer the question what does spiritual flourishing look like and how do Church Toddler Groups support it among very young children. More recently with church primary schools looking at how they facilitate opportunities for children's exploration of faith and spiritual life in the home.

We are a benefice of five churches, made up for a market town, large village and three small village / hamlets. Across the parishes we have four primary schools (two church schools) and one secondary. We have two weekly toddler groups (term time only) and average 30 baptism a year. Members of our churches serve as governors for our church schools and support the clergy in leading Collective Worship / assemblies in all four primary schools. We have led on after school groups focused around Mental Wellbeing with primary aged children these have included material based on Happiness Club and the Renew Café Five ways to Wellbeing.

Our two largest churches have monthly Family Worship which about 7 times a year are School Sundays. Each year group from our church schools has an opportunity to come and help lead our worship. This begins with the member of the ministry team visiting the whole class. We discuss the theme and the bible passage and prepare something that can be shared during the Sunday Service.

Working alongside colleagues from Churches Together we are just beginning to start to work with

	our secondary school to offer a Wellbeing Café in school at lunchtimes. This will initially be for KS3 (year 7&8) but also looking to make it open to staff as well. We are also restarting cakes in the staff room (something that was also impacted by COVID) and extend that to the 6 <sup>th</sup> form area once a month, based on a chaplaincy model of someone being around for anyone who wants to chat.
